 Urgent Care

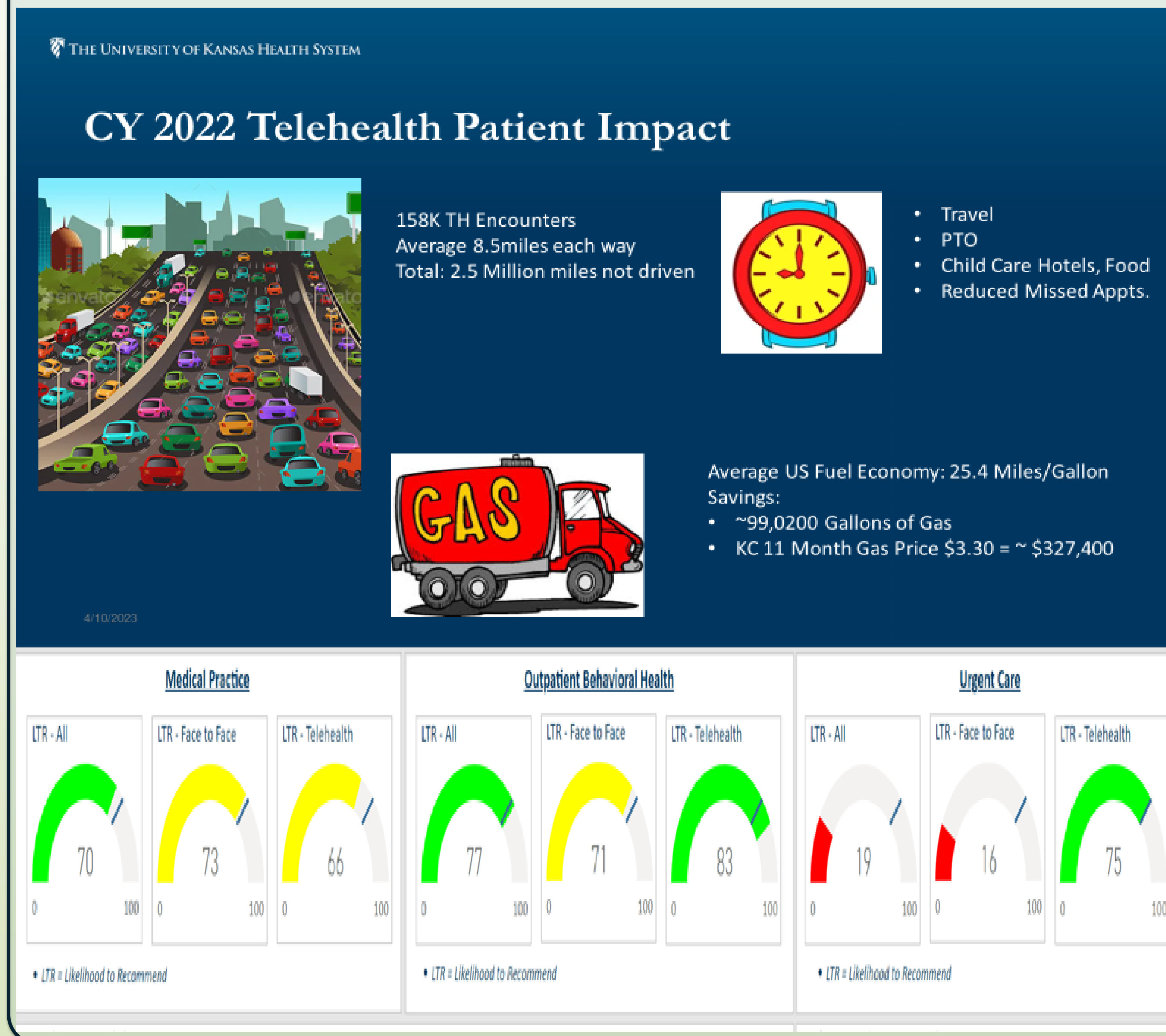
Great Bend, KS experiencing many telehealth firsts
